A Crochet Scarf

A crochet scarf is a simple project which a beginner can attempt. You could even start with a doll's scarf!

Directions for Crochet Scarf

You can use any weight of yarn you choose, so long as you choose a crochet hook to match. A size 3.00 crochet hook would suit 5 ply yarn, a size 4.00 for 8 ply for average workers.

You will need 2-3 50g balls of yarn, depending on the length of scarf you would like. You could also use up scraps of yarn you have on hand, so long as they are the same weight.

Row 1: Crochet 48 chain



Row 2: 1 treble into 3rd chain from end, 1 treble into each chain until the end - 46 trebles



Row3: Turn, 3 chain for 1st treble, 1 treble into next 3 trebles, * 2 chain, miss 2 trebles, 1 treble into next treble, repeat from * until last 4 trebles, 1 treble into next 4 trebles.



Row 4: Repeat row 3 until work is the desired length.







Last row 3 chain for first treble, 1 treble into each treble to the end of the row.

Fringe is made by crocheting 40 chain one double crochet into next treble, 40 chain repeat until the end You can make a traditional fringe if you like, but they are inclined to get a little ragged on the ends.

Repeat fringe on other end of scarf.

Darn in all loose ends.

Enjoy wearing in the winter!

Need more help with basic crochet stitches?

If you are an absolute beginner at crochet, or if you have forgotten how to work a treble, or what 2 chain, miss 2 trebles, 1 treble into next treble means, and you have no-one on hand to show you in person, then try youtube. A word of warning though: most use American crochet terms, not UK/Australian ones. So when they say 'single crochet' do an Australian double crochet stitch. The pattern above has been written with Australian crochet terms.

UK/Australian Crochet Terms	American Crochet Terms
double crochet (dc)	single crochet (sc)
half treble (htr)	half double crochet (hdc)
treble (tr)	double crochet (dc)
double treble (dtr)	treble (tr)
triple treble (trtr)	double treble (dtr)
miss	skip
tension	gauge
yarn over hook (yoh)	yarn over (yo)
